Fieldwork

I am interested in the documentation of the tense–aspect–modality systems of selected Bhili and Khandeshi languages (under-studied members of the Central subgroup of the Indo-Aryan family). With this goal, I have done short-term field research (between 3 and 6 weeks per session) in communities speaking *Ahirani* (2004), *Dehawali Bhili* (2004, 2008), *Pawri* (2003–04, 2008, 2012, 2013, 2014), *Noiri* (2008, 2012), and *Kukna-Dang* (2004, 2012, 2014) languages.

Corpus building

I am working on developing a digital corpus of Old Marathi together with Oliver Hellwig, a computational Sanskritist. This corpus, equipped with a morphological analyzer, currently has 40,000 words and is being expanded to cover a larger range of texts from different periods in the history of Marathi.

We are also in the beginning stages of planning and constructing a corpus for the Middle Indo-Aryan period; the goal is to work on a morohological analyzer and a dependency grammar for a selection of prose texts from between 500CE and 800CE. The first stage – creating electronic versions of four key texts – has been completed.
